UBIQUITOUS REQUIREMENTS

Every LEAD Scholar will be required to complete the following on a <u>monthly</u> basis:

- Attend one (1) Extra Leadership Learning Opportunity (ELLO) and submit documentation before midnight the last day of the month
- Attend and participate fully in one (1) LEAD Scholars workshop
- Attend and participate fully in one (1) LEADALL event (event with all LEAD scholars; see annual timeline below)
- Make necessary progress on class specific requirements and submit documentation before midnight the last day of the month

CLASS SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS

FIRST YEAR SCHOLARS: RISING LEADERS

- 1. Explore campus/community involvement and identify leadership role(s) for sophomore year
- 2. Meet with junior mentor at least once a month

SOPHOMORE SCHOLARS: ACTIVE LEADERS

- 1. Participate in at least one leadership role in campus or community
- 2. Design and execute LEADALL community service

JUNIOR SCHOLARS: MENTORING LEADERS

- 1. Meet with first year mentee at least once a month
- 2. Design and execute as host or co-host at least one (1) LEAD Scholars Workshop

SENIOR SCHOLARS: LEADING LEADERS

- 1. Assume leadership role (officer, advisory board or committee chair) within program
- 2. Design and execute campus wide LEADALL events

ANNUAL CONSEQUENCE SYSTEM

Every scholar has two annual "Free Passes" to miss events without any justification or alternative/make-up event requirement.

We encourage scholars to save these two free passes/absences for general sick days (w/o doctor's excuse) or for important personal plans (like a weekend away, family holiday or celebration, etc.) instead of using them "just because" but they can be used at every scholar's own discretion.

Failure to attend a required event because of a true emergency or for a pre-approved reason from the list below will result in *an event alternative to complete.*

*Scholars can pre-approve absences for the following reasons and receive alternative accommodations at no penalty:

- Illness/surgery with documentation from doctor/hospital
- Direct academic class conflict (the actual class session is in conflict)
 - Mandatory athletic conflict for student athletes (w/documentation)
- University conference attendance (representing University and/or paid for by University)
- Work conflict where the student has provided a written statement from their employer where the employer confirms the employee asked more than two weeks in advance for the time off and was denied the time off request by the employer

After using both "Free Passes", failure to attend a required event (not pre-approved or a true emergency) –or- failure to complete the alternative event by deadline will result in a *Written Warning*

Two written warnings will result in a termination notice (pending opportunity to appeal to the *LEAD Scholars Advisory Board*).

Inconvenience or preferring to do something else are not reasons for alternate accommodations.
